The regular meeting of the Town Board was held on Wednesday, October 13, 2010, at the LaGrange Town Hall, 120 Stringham Road. Supervisor Wagner called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. The Town Clerk led the flag salute.

Supervisor Wagner asked for a motion to approve the minutes for the regular meeting on September 22, 2010. Councilman Beck so moved, seconded by Councilman Jessup and carried by all.

He asked for a motion to approve minutes for a special meeting held on October 4, 2010. Councilman Jessup so moved, seconded by Councilman Luna and carried by all.

Mr. Wagner then asked for a motion to approve the minutes for a special meeting held on October 6, 2010.

Councilman O'Hare moved to do so, seconded by Councilman Beck and carried unanimously.

**Public Hearing**

Supervisor Wagner asked for a motion to open the Public Hearing for the Fact Finder's Report and Recommendations for a Collective Bargaining Agreement with the Civil Service Employees Association, Inc. pursuant to the Taylor Law's requirement due to an impasse in contract negotiations. The Union had rejected the Fact Finder's Report.

Councilman Luna so moved seconded by Councilman Beck and carried unanimously.

There were three highway employees present: Brian Aldrich, Union President, Joe Tighe, Union Vice President and Douglas Russell.

Supervisor Wagner stated for the record that the recommendations made by Tia Schneider Deneberg in the Fact – Finding Report would be made part of the permanent record and inserted into the minutes. (SEE ADDENDUM)

There was no comment from the public; however, Supervisor Wagner stated that this report was not due to any poor reflection on the highway employees' work. He acknowledged that they do a

great job and he appreciated their understanding of the difficult financial times the Town is facing. They will try and get back to negotiations to hammer something out for 2011. Councilman Jessup moved to close the Public Hearing seconded by Councilman Luna and carried by all.

Mr. Wagner read the resolution regarding the Fact- Finders Report into the record. The Board voted to pass the resolution on September 22, 2010. (SEE ADDENDUM) After the Public Hearing, the Town Board voted by oral resolution to impose employment terms as the following: no other changes to contract with the exception of no raise for 2010. Councilman Luna moved to impose the terms, seconded by Councilman O'Hare and carried unanimously.

### **Public Hearing**

Mr. Wagner asked for a motion to open the Public Hearing for the establishment of the Harvest Ridge Subdivision Drainage District.

Mr. Blass explained that the establishment of the drainage district is customary and necessary to assess any homes or lands in that subdivision for stormwater management costs in that district to relieve the general tax base from that obligation. It is a new subdivision with no one living there as yet.

Councilman Jessup so moved, seconded by Councilman O'Hare and carried by all.

There were no comments.

Councilman Luna moved to close the Public Hearing seconded by Councilman Beck and carried unanimously.

Supervisor Wagner asked for a motion to accept the monthly reports for September 2010. Councilman O'Hare so moved seconded by Councilman Luna and carried by all.

### **Supervisor's Report**

The renovation downstairs to make a police locker room is being done in house for just under \$300 and will result in having 8 State Troopers assigned here. This was done with no additional cost to taxpayers. Mr. Wagner stated that this will benefit the Town, especially since there will likely be expenses passed on to municipalities by the County for sheriff patrol coverage. Having the troopers based out of the Town Hall will give the Town a much needed police presence.

As President of the Mayors and Supervisors Association, Mr. Wagner has written to New York State elected officials and County Executive in support of Mr. Steinhaus' stand to stop unfunded mandates. The letter went one step farther in asking for legislation from state legislators to outlaw all unfunded mandates and pass downs, including the County to municipalities.

The 2011 budget is still being worked on, with further cuts being considered. The Town Board is currently meeting with all department heads and a budget workshop will be held on 10/20. The estimate for retirement costs has increased from \$90,000 to \$140,000. State revenue sharing has decreased by 6%. The schedules of department head budget meetings is on the website and open to the public. There will be no more Dial-A- Ride funding from Dutchess County Office of the Aging. Mr. Wagner is looking into alternatives.

### **Correspondence**

Time Warner has a list of channel changes. The list will be on file in the Clerk's office for 2 weeks.

The Town Board will establish escrow in the amount of \$5,000 for the Lakes of LaGrange (Red Wing Properties). This will ensure that bills such as legal fees are charged to the applicant. The development is not yet approved but is pending. Councilman O'Hare moved to establish the escrow, seconded by Councilman Luna.

The motion was carried.

The Highway Superintendent requested Board approval to award the Road Sweeping and Highway Materials bids to the lowest bidder. (SEE ADDENDUM) This had previously been on the agenda, but some clarification was required. Councilman Jessup and Councilman Beck were satisfied that the bid information had been clarified. Councilman Jessup moved to award the bids, seconded by Councilman O'Hare and carried by all.

A request for a reduction of the Performance Bond for Frank Farm Phase 2 in the amount of \$475,575 which is 25% of the original bond amount was presented to the Board. Councilman O'Hare moved to approve the reduction, seconded by Councilman Jessup and carried unanimously.

The Chairman of the Conservation Advisory Council requested permission to attend the 2010 Conference on the Environment which will be held on November 19-21 in West Point. The cost will be \$575.50.

Mr. Wagner stated that Mr. Htoo works very hard for the Town and often does so at his own expense. The amount of the conference with overnight stay is above the remaining budget amount for the CAC. It would be necessary to make a budget amendment to finance the conference expenses. Mr. Beck was against doing that and Mr. Jessup concurred. A motion to

deny the request was made by Councilman Beck and seconded by Councilman Jessup. A brief discussion followed.

Councilman Beck stated he would make a motion to approve the trip if the overnight stay was eliminated from the expenses. Councilman Jessup seconded that motion and it carried unanimously.

The Building Inspector requested Town Board approval to release the Site Grading Bond in the amount of \$2,500 for grid 6562-01-330958, 409 Rossway Road.

Councilman Jessup moved to approve the release seconded by Councilman O'Hare and carried by all.

Mr. McLaughlin asked the Board to release Soil Erosion Bonds for 38, 47 and 25 Southview Court grid # 6360-03390387, 6360-03-335429, 6360-03-351335.

Councilman Beck moved to do so seconded by Councilman O'Hare and carried by all.

Councilman Jessup stated that the Pierson farm project should be done by the end of the year. He asked the Board to approve a survey which would cost about \$11,000.

Councilman Luna so moved seconded by Councilman Jessup and carried by all.

Councilman Jessup and Superintendent Kelly are still looking at salt sheds. Councilman Luna asked if that information would be brought back to the Board. Mr. Jessup stated it would.

#### **Administrator of Public Works**

Ms. Livigni stated that the item on the agenda regarding awarding a bid for demolition of the former Titusville Wastewater Treatment Plant had already been taken care of and that the demolition will proceed on Monday. Also the GIGP project at the Titusville Waste Water Treatment plant was very successful and the construction was completed. She reported that the improvement to the aeration system was tremendous. She thanked Environmental Consultants for their assistance. The Board thanked Ms. Livigni for her work on the project.

**Environmental Consultants**

Ms. Campaglione stated that there had been a water main break at Noxon Road with a 30,000 gallon spill which had been repaired.

**Public Comment**

Councilman Luna moved to open the meeting to Public Comment. Councilman O'Hare seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

Paul Dougherty addressed the Board. Improvements at Red Wing Recreation area have been made by the football groups. Parking for 120 cars is available, but an additional parking lot is under construction. One of the volunteers oil and chipped the driveway into the parking area and part of the parking area. One of the fields is named after his deceased son. A flag pole and a 6 by 10 flag along with a scoreboard were erected by the football group. He added that the scenery is very good right now.

Sean Donahue addressed the Board, asking Councilman Beck why he recused himself from the escrow vote for the Red Wing Properties. Supervisor Wagner replied that that was correct. Councilman Beck replied he did so because that is one of his clients. Mr. Donohue asked if Mr. Beck felt it was a potential conflict of interest and Councilman Beck replied yes. Mr. Donahue said he just wanted to know why and that he didn't know if there was a specific reason or not and that he appreciated Councilman Beck's honesty.

Councilman Luna moved to close the Public Comment, seconded by Councilman Jessup and carried by all.

Councilman Jessup moved to adjourn, seconded by Councilman O'Hare and carried by all.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:55 p.m.

**BACKGROUND**

The parties jointly declared an impasse on January 28, 2010, in their negotiations over a successor agreement to the current contract (January 1, 2009-December 31, 2009). The declaration included the dates of their negotiation (November 20, December 17, and December 22, 2009, as well as January 13 and January 21, 2010). The unresolved issues were

- wage increases
- medical insurance premium contributions
- suspension of vacation accrual buy-back

- longevity (exclude new hires)
- compensatory time (reduce for new hires)
- vacation accumulations
- payment of unused sick leave

The parties met with a PERB mediator but were unsuccessful in resolving the matter. The undersigned was appointed on April 27, 2010, to act as fact-finder. Sessions were held on July 1, July 6, and July 9, 2010, during which the fact-finder explored the open issues with the parties, viewed in the context of the difficult fiscal realities facing public employment in New York State.<sup>1</sup>

The following is the Fact-Finder's recommendation for the settlement of this matter:

### **#1 - Wage Rates**

**5.1.1 Wage Schedule:** The Town shall pay wages to all employees in the negotiating unit represented by the Union, according to the wage schedule attached to and made part of this collective bargaining agreement, which reflects an across-the-board increase of four percent on December 31, 2011 at 11:59 p.m.

**5.1.2 Rules for Wage Schedule:** All new employees will be hired at the hiring rate as shown on the Wage Schedule - Appendix A. All employees hired at the hiring rate will advance one step on the first payday of each January until the employee reaches the job rate, as shown on the Wage Schedule - Appendix A.

### **#2 - Medical Insurance Premiums**

**9.1.4 Premium Payment:** The Town will pay 88 percent of the monthly premium for individual medical coverage, 88 percent of the monthly premium for two-person coverage, or 88 percent of the monthly premium for family medical insurance coverage, as the case may be, for each regular full-time employee. The employee's contribution to the medical insurance premium will be deducted from the employee's paycheck.

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<sup>1</sup> The last session was a lengthy conference call.

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Effective December 31, 2011, the Town will pay 85 percent of the monthly premium for individual coverage, two-person coverage, or family coverage, as the case may be. The employee's contribution to the premium will be deducted from the employee's regular paycheck. The employee may designate that the deduction be made on a pre-tax basis on a form which shall be provided by the Town.

### **#3 - Vacation Buy-Back**

**7.2.5 Annual Buy-Back:** The following provision shall be suspended from January 1, 2010, through December 31, 2011. An employee may elect to receive cash payment for up to forty hours of accumulated vacation leave credits during any calendar year (January 1 through December 31). Payment shall be made within the pay period following the date the request was made. Payment shall be at the employee's then current rate of pay. To be eligible for this buy-back, the employee must give notice on or before October 15th prior to the fiscal year in which the employee intends to receive the payment (this requirement will be waived in cases of a fiscal emergency).

### **#4 - Vacation Accumulation**

**7.2.4 Accumulation:** For an employee before January 1, 2010, the employee may accumulate vacation time without limit. Employees may save up to one-half of their vacation each year towards retirement. An employee must use at least one-half of their annual vacation each year, and the remaining portion up to one-half may be saved. At retirement, an employee will be paid for all vacation that is on the books at the employee's then current rate of pay. To be eligible for this cash out, the employee must give notice of retirement on or before October 15th prior to the fiscal year in which the employee intends to retire (this requirement will be waived in cases of disability retirement or other emergency that necessitates retirement).

For an employee hired on or after January 1, 2010, the employee may accumulate vacation time without limit. Employees may save up to one-half of their vacation each year towards retirement. An employee must use at least one-half of their annual vacation each year, and the remaining portion up to one-half may be saved. At retirement, an employee will be paid for all vacation that is on the books at 50 percent of the employee's then current rate of pay. To be eligible for this cash out,

the employee must give notice of retirement on or before October 15th prior to the fiscal year in which the employee intends to retire (this requirement will be waived in cases of disability retirement or other emergency that necessitates retirement).

#### #5 - Payment for Unused Sick-Leave

**7.3.10 Retirement Buy-Back:** The following provision applies only to Richard Gatto, Arthur Daniels, and Daniel McCallister: An employee who retires from the Town and has applied for and been granted a retirement benefit from the New York State Employees' Retirement System may elect to receive cash payment for those unused sick leave credits accumulated prior to January 1, 1997 at one hundred percent (100 percent) of the employee's rate of pay at the time of retirement and for those unused sick leave credits accumulated since January 1, 1997 at fifty percent (50 percent) of the employee's rate of pay at the time of retirement.<sup>2</sup>

#### #6 - Overtime Assignment

**6.1.3 Procedure for Assigning Overtime Work:** Overtime work shall be awarded according to seniority by job classification (MEO then HMEO then Mechanic then Mechanics Helper) to the extent that an employee in a given job classification is required for overtime work. In the event no employee volunteers, the work will be assigned on a seniority basis (least senior first) to all regular full-time employees in the affected job title.

An employee promoted to a higher job title shall be placed last on the list of seniority within that title for purposes of overtime assignment; and in the event that that employee is demoted to a lower job classification, the employee shall be returned to the employee's former position on the seniority list for overtime work assignment. Also, an employee shall not be assigned to work out of the employee's classification, if an employee from the needed job title is available.

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<sup>2</sup> For all other employees, unused sick leave may be applied as set forth in 7.3.9 of the current collective bargaining agreement.

In the event that an employee is called for overtime for snow removal and in the event that the employee is unable to respond to such call due to sickness or absence from the employee's home at the time said call is made, such failure to respond shall not be a cause to refuse to assign overtime to said employee. An employee who takes "family sick leave" in accordance with section 7.3.5, will remain eligible for overtime.

### **#7 - Holdover Overtime**

**5.3.1 Holdover Minimum:** If an employee is required to work beyond the employee's regular work day, the employee will be paid for at least one hour at the overtime rate of pay. For example, if an employee is required to work twenty minutes beyond the employee's regular quitting time, the employee will be paid for one hour at the employee's overtime rate; if the employee is required to work ninety minutes beyond the employee's regular quitting time, because the employee will have worked for more than one hour, the employee will be paid for ninety minutes at the employee's overtime rate.

### **#8 - Personal Leave**

**7.4.1 Allowance (front-loaded):** On January 1, 2010 each full-time employee will be credited with twenty-four hours of paid personal leave. On January 1, 2011, each full-time employee will be credited with thirty-two hours of paid personal leave; thereafter, each full-time employee will be credited with thirty-two hours of paid personal leave on January 1st of each year.

Additional personal leave days may be given at the discretion of the Highway Superintendent or Recreation Director, where an emergency situation warrants such action. Should the employee disagree with the decision of the Highway Superintendent or Recreation Director, the Town Board will review and render final decision.

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**#9 - Incremental Use of Leave Credits**

**7.2.7 Scheduling:** Vacation may not be used in less than thirty-minute increments. No employee shall be allowed to take more than four continuous weeks in any calendar year.

**7.3.4 Scheduling:** Sick time can be used in thirty-minute increments.

**#10 - Layoff Leave Accruals**

**11.3.6 Leave Accruals:** An employee who is laid off will have the option of being paid for whatever leave credits the employee is eligible to be paid for or choosing to "bank" any or all of those leave credits in the event the employee is recalled. If the employee chooses to bank credits and the employee is not recalled or otherwise returned to work within 36 months, the employee will be paid for all leave credits the employee is eligible to be paid for at the rate of pay at the time of the layoff. (Note: the employee may elect to be paid at any time during this 36-month period.) This provision does not apply to compensatory leave credits which must be paid out.

WHEREAS, fact-finding hearings were held on July 1, July 6, and July 9, 2010, during which the Fact-Finder explored the open issues with the parties, viewed in the context of the difficult fiscal realities facing public employment in New York State; and,

WHEREAS, the Fact-Finder's report and recommendations, which is attached to this resolution, were issued on July 23, 2010; and,

WHEREAS, the bargaining unit members rejected the Fact-Finder's recommendations on or about August 12, 2010; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the Taylor Law, if one or both parties do not accept the fact-finding report in its entirety, then the next step is for the Town Board to conduct a public hearing at which the parties may explain their positions with respect to the Fact-Finder's report and recommendations and, thereafter, the Town Board may take such action as it deems to be in the public interest, including the interest of the employees involved; and,

WHEREAS, after the public hearing, the Town Board may choose to impose employment terms for the period January 1, 2010 to December 31, 2010 provided such imposition does not change the terms of an expired collective bargaining agreement, now, therefore be it




